## Documentary Film Presentation:

### The Bibliophile as Bookbinder

The Angling Bindings of S.A. Neff, Jr.

**Wednesday, April 6, 2016 at 7 p.m. in Calvary's Parish Hall**

This documentary is about one man's passions: books and angling for trout. In the early 1980s, Mr. Neff transitioned from a career in graphic design to hand bookbinding. An autodidact by nature, he began his training with occasional workshops and seminars. Since 1986 his work has been exhibited in the U.S. and abroad.

The first part of the film invites the viewer into the angling library which contains over 3,000 volumes (created over five decades) with a focus on fly-fishing for trout and salmon. The second part introduces Sid's favorite sets of binding and discusses concepts and techniques that distinguish his skillful creations. His collection of angling bindings is unique in its genre.

- ❖ **Credence table.** A small table for holding vessels and other needed items for Communion. At Calvary, there is a credence used at the 9 o'clock service set on the platform just below the pulpit and a larger credence to the right of the High Altar.
- ❖ **Pentateuch.** From the Greek meaning "five" and "book." It refers to the first five books of the Bible also sometimes known as the Books of Moses. They are Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. The Hebrew word to denote the Pentateuch is "Torah."

### The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to John [20:19-31]

*Response before the Gospel:* Glory to you, LORD Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the LORD. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the LORD." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My LORD and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
