



If you do not wish to receive directly from the chalice, you may dip a portion of the wafer carefully into the wine, or you may simply cross your arms over your chest as the Chalice Bearer passes.

After receiving Communion, those who would like to receive laying on of hands and prayers for healing may go to the altar rail in the Lady Chapel.

Our Parish Life

We welcome The Rt. Rev. Kenneth L. Price as our guest preacher today at the 9 and 11 a.m. services. Bishop Price retired after serving faithfully as Provisional Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh until October 2012. We are very happy to have him with us.

Liturgical Note

Throughout the Great Fifty Days of Easter, we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection. During this festival season at Calvary, we will omit the Confession and Absolution from our liturgy. As the scholar Marion Hatchett observes: "Confession is the obverse of thanksgiving; to give thanks for redemption is to acknowledge one's sinfulness." In this Eastertide, we give thanks to God for the mercy and forgiveness declared to us by Christ's victory over sin and death.

Prayers for Healing

Prayer for healing has long been significant in the life of Calvary Church. At the invitation of Calvary's rector John Baiz, Emily Gardner Neal began a decade of healing ministry here in 1966, and healing services have continued since then. *The Book of Common Prayer* (page 455) provides for ministry to the sick, including prayer, laying on of hands, and anointing. Many have expressed appreciation for the healing prayers during Lent, so prayers for healing will continue to be offered at the 11 a.m. Sunday Eucharist. After they have received Communion, those wishing to receive the laying on of hands may come to the altar rail in the Lady Chapel, where one of the clergy will pray for them. We invite all who seek healing of body, mind, or spirit to come for this sacramental sign of God's grace and Christ's healing presence.

Inquirers' Class

To be a Christian means to live life in response to God, and the Episcopal and Anglican tradition offers a broad and comprehensive way to live out that life. This series of classes is designed for adults who wish to explore what it means to be a Christian in the Episcopal tradition. It is ideal for those who are new to Calvary and the Episcopal Church. These brilliant and magnificent examples of the art of stained-glass are dedicated to the history of the early Christian Church in the British Isles, portraying in particular British and Welsh saints, martyrs and missionaries of the first ten centuries, A.D. The tour will last approximately 25 minutes. 

The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to John [20:19-31]

Response before the Gospel: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
