



## MUSICAL NOTES

Jesus' words from St. John's Gospel, "I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life," are the inspiration for one of the best-loved poems in the Anglican canon. "The Call," by the seventeenth-century Anglican cleric and poet George Herbert, elaborates on "way," "truth," "life," and other descriptions of the divine, as poet and singers alike invoke the presence of God.

Peter Aston (b. 1938) is a present-day composer living in the vicinity of Norwich Cathedral, of which he is a minor canon. (That puts him not far from Ely Cathedral, where the sixteenth-century composer John Amner is thought to have passed much of his career.) Aston's choral music fuses traditional form and musical vocabulary with a somewhat more modern harmonic sensibility.

This afternoon at 5 p.m., the Friends of Music present a performance by the Collegium Musicum of Oberlin College, an *a cappella* choir of about forty voices. Their program includes joyful music by Palestrina, Byrd, Victoria, Hassler, and other composers, and will last about 70 minutes. Admission is free, and all are welcome.

Next Sunday, after the Marathon runners clear the streets, you are invited to attend the East End Choral Festival, in which Calvary's choir will join with the choirs of Shadyside and East Liberty Presbyterian and St. Andrew's Episcopal Church Highland Park. The event takes place at East Liberty Presbyterian Church (South Highland Avenue at Penn Avenue) at 4 p.m. David Hill, sometime Organist of Winchester Cathedral and St. John's College, Cambridge, and currently the director of the BBC Singers and the London Bach Choir, will be the guest-conductor, directing Benjamin Britten's *Rejoice in the Lamb*, Randall Thompson's *The Peaceable Kingdom*, and other music, including congregational hymns. A freewill offering will be accepted. Please come!

On Sunday, May 12th, you will find a blue envelope in your service bulletin marking the spring ingathering of UTO, the United Thank Offering. WoC (Women of Calvary), which coordinates this collection, wholeheartedly encourages members of the congregation as well as visitors to make a contribution to this worthy charitable undertaking.

## Liturgical Note

Throughout the Great Fifty Days of Easter, we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection. During this festival season at Calvary, we will omit the Confession and Absolution from our liturgy. As the scholar Marion Hatchett observes: "Confession is the obverse of thanksgiving; to give thanks for redemption is to acknowledge one's sinfulness." In this Eastertide, we give thanks to God for the mercy and forgiveness declared to us by Christ's victory over sin and death.

Many have expressed appreciation for the healing prayers during Lent, so prayers for healing will continue to be offered at the 11 a.m. Sunday Eucharist. After they have received Communion, those wishing to receive the laying on of hands may come to the altar rail in the Lady Chapel, where one of the clergy will pray for them. ## A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles [11:1-18]

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, LORD; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the LORD, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the LORD Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."
