





If you do not wish to receive directly from the chalice, you may dip a portion of the wafer carefully into the wine, or you may simply cross your arms over your chest as the Chalice Bearer passes.

After receiving Communion, those who would like to receive laying on of hands and prayers for healing may go to the altar rail in the Lady Chapel.

## MUSICAL NOTES

This Thursday, May 5, is Ascension Day, the commemoration of the day on which the risen Jesus rose into heaven, as recounted at the close of Luke's Gospel, and the outset of the Acts of the Apostles. (It always falls forty days after Easter, a kind of joyful mirror of Lent.) The Calvary Choir joins the choir of St. Andrew's, Highland Park in a festive service of Evensong on that date, at 8 p.m., at St. Andrew's (Hampton Street at N. Euclid). Our Associate Rector, T.J. Freeman, will be the preacher, and a reception follows. All are welcome.

The Prelude is a quartet of chorale-based works by Bach, from his "*Little Organ Book*," which he compiled across his twenties and thirties as a compendium of small-form treatments of popular Lutheran melodies. Though the book remained unfinished at his death (containing only 45 of the originally projected 168 pieces), its contents have become iconic exemplars of the sorts of musical rhetoric for which Bach is justly famous. The accompanimental textures, motifs, and harmonies throughout the collection are remarkably expressive of the texts and meanings of the chorales, and Bach ultimately claimed to have intended the collection as a model of what was possible in small-form composition of this type.

**Due to the City of Pittsburgh Marathon blocking access, we will celebrate the Holy Eucharist today at 8 a.m. (no 9 or 11 o'clock services this weekend) and at 5 p.m.**

NEWCOMERS AND GUESTS are always welcome at Calvary Church. Our service uses the three books located in the pew: *The Book of Common Prayer*, *The Hymnal 1982*, and *Lift Every Voice and Sing II*. Directions in the service bulletin indicate where it is customary to stand or kneel. We invite you to participate as you are able. We hope you will take a moment to read and complete the Welcome Card in the pew, and place it in the offertory plate as it passes.

WEEKLY OFFERING CARDS that say "My gift comes electronically or by mail" can serve as a visible sign of your gift. Look for the purple cards in a basket in the Narthex or by the North Transept door each week, take one, and place it in the offering plate.

## A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles [16:9-15]

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The LORD opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the LORD, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

**A Reading from the Revelation to John {21:10, 22–22:5}**

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the LORD God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day – and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the LORD God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

{14:23-29}
