The Rev. John Fetterman will lead a special series of forums exploring the church’s response to same-gender relationships – how the Anglican tradition approaches these significant questions. # On Human Sexuality

Series of Forums on Sundays, June 2, 9, 16, and 23, 2013 at 10 a.m.



**The Rev. John Fetterman** will lead a special series of forums exploring the church's response to same-gender relationships – how the Anglican tradition approaches these significant questions. Presentations will include stories of human experience as well as theological reflection. The series will draw from *Reasonable and Holy* by Tobias Stanislas Haller. The book may be ordered through the Calvary Bookstore. A reading guide to be used with the book has been

prepared by Fr. Fetterman. The guide may be picked up from the Bookstore along with the book. Reading the book is not required for participation. A list of other suggested readings will also be available during the series. Join us for as many of the sessions as you can – it is not necessary to attend all of them. We look forward to this opportunity for learning and conversation.

## Session I – June 2: Introductory Notions

**This outline generally follows Tobias Haller's book**

1. Overview of topic – a thesis statement
2. Outline of responses to the thesis:
  - a. Use of the Bible – How is it helpful?
  - b. Some principles of interpretation
  - c. Exposition of terminology
    - metaphor, myth, anachronism
    - sodomy, lesbianism (origins of terms)
    - gender, sex
    - legal, moral
3. Purpose of marriage – two not one

## Session II – June 9: The care of the young

1. Guest Speaker – Phil Parr, Pres. Proteus Counsel
  - a. How to help children understand their development
2. Argument from complementarity – misused
3. Defective science for centuries re. male and female contributions to procreation
4. Use of Symbols – essential for our humanity to function
  - a. Biblical language about sex is very limited, almost never erotic and highly metaphorical

### Session III – June 16: The History of a marriage

1. Guest Speakers – Gordon Fisher and Wesley Scott
2. In Canon Law the ministers of the marriage are the people exchanging “the words”
3. The Bible and other insights
  - a. There are a variety of conflicting interpretations concerning the six classical texts regarding homosexuality. I will identify a position endorsed by our General Convention. Please consult handout for details of interpretations.
  - b. Inadequacy of “proof texts”
  - c. The Bible is God’s word, but not the words of God. Not a dictated text like the Koran
  - d. Can the Bible be wrong? It depends on the issue
  - e. We place a very high value on experience (i.e. holy lives) and reason

2. Review of Haller’s *A Better Way* p88ff

4. Church law has, in fact, changed Bible directives over time
  - a. divorce and remarriage
  - b. owning of slaves
  - c. charging of interest (usury)
  - d. position of women
5. Excellent summary quote about development of doctrine on p. 119

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the LORD's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved.'

I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it. “If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. [“I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.]
