MUSICAL NOTES

The *Te Deum* is an ancient Christian hymn of praise. It can be traced back at least to the early sixth century, and may well be older yet. It is printed on pp. 52 and 95 (in older and more modern idioms, respectively) in *The Book of Common Prayer*. The *Te Deum* (whose title comes from its opening words in Latin) falls in three broad sections: a Trinitarian acclamation of God's majesty, a more focused section of praise to Jesus, and a series of verses quoted from the Psalms (separated in the 1979 Prayer Book as "Suffrages B" in Morning Prayer, on pp. 55 and 98).

Musical settings of the *Te Deum* were a regular fixture of Christian liturgy from monastic times into the modern era, particularly in the Daily Office. Most of these are conceived for vocal performance, with or without accompaniment, but the setting heard this morning is a series of organ "versets," short, independent pieces based either on a portion of the plainsong formula traditionally associated with the *Te Deum*, or simply corresponding to the sequential verses of the canticle. It is generally thought that verses of the canticle were to be sung in alternation with the organ-versets. Louis Marchand (1669-1732) was a French organist and harpsichordist of great renown; in addition to a number of Parisian church-posts, he spent some time in service at the royal court. His *Te Deum* is preserved in a manuscript in the library at Versailles.

The first choral piece at Communion today was composed to mark the forty-fifth wedding anniversary (yesterday) of Sue and Sid Neff. The Choir offers them its congratulations and best wishes.

Bach's Fugue in E flat major is often heard on Trinity Sunday; its key-signature (3 flats) and architecture (three distinct fugue-subjects, developed independently but then combining and interweaving) are a musical allusion to this central Christian doctrine. It is fitting to juxtapose Bach's Fugue with Marchand's *Te Deum*; German musical lore holds that, in 1717, Marchand was visiting Dresden, and a musical competition between him and J.S. Bach was arranged – but then never took place, as Marchand slipped away before Bach's arrival. (In fairness, it should be noted that this anecdote is not supported by any French sources, and modern historians have been unsuccessful in substantiating it.)

Next Sunday the Summer Choir begins its season; rehearsals are at 10 a.m. for the 11 a.m. service. It's a good way to dip a toe in the musical waters, and explore an enthusiasm for singing, without a long-term commitment. Please, give it a try!

Focus Tour

Please join guides from the Architectural History Committee for a Focus Tour of the north (*Te Deum Laudamus*) and south (*British Saints*) transept windows **immediately after the 11 o'clock service**. We will meet at the crossing platform.

Have you ever wondered who are represented by the 90 figures in the North Transept Window? Look at the words of the ancient hymn, *Te Deum Laudamus*, (pp. 52 and 95 in the Prayer Book) and see if you can figure it out. Do you know who wrote the *Te Deum* (both the legend and the more likely truth) and when, where and why?

Have you wondered who are represented in the multiple medallions on the south transept window? Did you know that an Insular (British and Irish, Celtic) Christianity, substantially independent of the Roman church, existed in Britain and Ireland from at least the early years of the 3rd century until the two merged, beginning with the Synod of Whitby in 664?

Join Ken Stiles and Tom Smitherman of the AHC for a fascinating and informative review of these two large and beautiful windows.
