MUSICAL NOTES

J.S. Bach's Prelude and Fugue in E flat is one of his most imposing organ works, its two movements first published as musical "bookends" for a substantial collection of organ-preludes that appeared in 1739. Much theologizing has been expended on its structure over the years, seeking to relate its form, its key-signature, and its thematic content to the concept of the Trinity, and it has in many places become a standard musical fixture on Trinity Sunday.

MUSICAL NOTES

This year marks the centenary of the birth of Benjamin Britten (1913-76), who was one of the most significant English composers of the twentieth century. He composed in many genres, but is chiefly known for his operas, songs, and his (regrettably small) output of sacred choral music. *The Jubilate Deo* sung this morning was composed for the Chapel of St. George at Windsor Castle; its colorful accompaniment, jaunty vocal rhythms and the occasionally dissonant antiphony between upper and lower pairs of voices make it a distinctive entry in Anglicanism's vast repertoire of *Jubilate* settings.

Dame Julian of Norwich (b. 1342) was an *anchoress*, a kind of religious recluse, who earned a reputation for offering wise spiritual counsel through the window of her cell, a room adjacent to the Church of St. Julian in Norwich, England. Her *Revelations of Divine Love*, an account of a series of mystical visions she experienced as a young woman, is accounted the earliest surviving book in the English language to have been written by a woman. (Her actual name is unknown; the name by which she became known in her time, and since, derives from the church in which she lived out her decades of seclusion. William Mathias composed his setting of words drawn from the *Revelations of Divine Love* in 1987, for the choir of St. Paul's Cathedral, London; it closes with a refrain from Dame Julian's writing made familiar by T.S. Eliot, beginning *All shall be well...*

The Daily Office – Morning Prayer (7 a.m.) and Evening Prayer (5:30 p.m.) – will be prayed in the Lady Chapel on Monday through Thursday beginning on Tuesday, May 28. (Holy Eucharist will continue to be celebrated on Wednesday mornings at 7 a.m.). 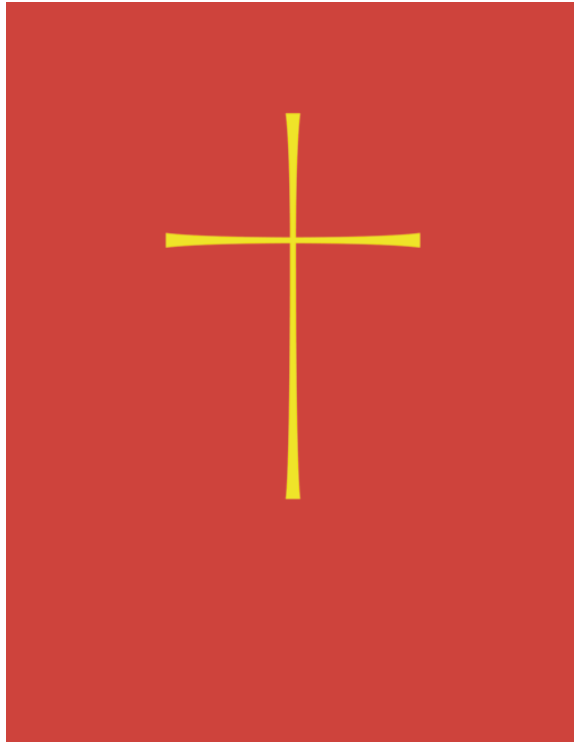
