



Both Felix Mendelssohn (1800-47) and his slightly older sister Fanny were a phenomenally gifted young musicians. They would surely have achieved international prominence as child-prodigies had their family exploited their abilities. Instead, they were allowed to cultivate their talents more quietly, studying with the finest teachers, and having access to a remarkable array of musical and cultural resources for their age. (For example, Felix conducted one of the first revivals of Bach's monumental *St. Matthew Passion* at the age of 20.) Once launched as a professional musician, Felix enjoyed international celebrity, both as a keyboard-player and as a composer. He was particularly appreciated in England, visiting there ten times; a number of his works, including his six organ sonatas and the oratorio *Elijah* were inspired by those visits, and also by his admiration for the music of Bach and Handel. The chorus "He watching over Israel" (based on a verse of today's Gradual Psalm) and the psalm-based air "O rest in the Lord" come from *Elijah*, which dates from 1846.

Henry Purcell's *Hear my prayer* is the surviving opening section of a much larger planned piece, likely to have been a setting of a substantial block of Psalm 102. Like all unfinished masterworks, it offers a tantalizing hint of what was not to be: it presents rich interplay of eight voice-parts locked in tight imitation of two contrasting motifs, one of them the simple plea, "Hear my prayer, O Lord," the other a rising line, often with chromatic inflections, setting "and let my cry..."

Newcomers and Guests are always welcome at Calvary Church. Our service uses the three books located in the pew: *The Book of Common Prayer*, *The Hymnal 1982*, and *Lift Every Voice and Sing*. Directions in the service bulletin indicate where it is customary to stand or kneel. We invite you to participate as you are able. We hope you will take a moment to read and complete the Welcome Card in the pew, and place it in the offertory plate as it passes.

Children of all ages are welcome in worship services. Packets of materials for children are available from the ushers. *Nursery Care available during the 9 a.m. and the 11 a.m. services.* The Infants' and Toddlers' Nursery is downstairs on the Christian Education level.

Weekly Offering Cards that say "My gift comes electronically or by mail" can serve as a visible sign of your gift. Look for the purple cards in a basket in the Narthex or by the North Transept door each week, take one, and place it in the offering plate.

# Christian Formation \_\_\_\_\_

## A Study on the Book of Acts

The class on the Book of Acts meets in McClintic Hall (choir room) at 10 a.m. each week. It is led by the Rev. Jonathon Jensen and Mr. Chuck Esposito. The only text we are using is the actual book of the Bible itself which is 28 chapters.

The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

**The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Luke**

[18:1-8]
