## MUSICAL NOTES

This afternoon at 4 p.m., organist Robert Nicholls, currently based in Evansville, Indiana, performs in the Organ Artists Series here at Calvary. An alumnus of the Choir of Westminster Abbey, and a graduate of Cambridge University, Robert is the 2012 winner of the National Competition in Organ Improvisation of the American Guild of Organists. His program will include both composed music (by Preston, Bach, Delius, and Lamare) and improvisations, including one inspired by the “Te Deum” window in the North Transept. Complimentary tickets are available at Coffee Hour, or at the door this afternoon.

Today’s choral and organ music celebrate the centennial of the birth of Benjamin Britten (the day itself falls on Friday). Britten was one of the most original and distinctive voices of mid-century English music, and his compositions, not only for the Church but also for the concert hall, operatic stage, and for students, made a lasting mark on the musical landscape. The Prelude is the opening section of his most famous cantata, *Rejoice in the Lamb*, based on a quirky but eloquent poem by the eighteenth century poet Christopher Smart. In this portion of the work, all the inhabitants of the earth are called upon to praise God, with a variety of obscure and better-known Biblical figures associated with particular acts of sacrifice and praise, all leading into a placid and beautiful “Hallelujah.”

The Offertory Anthem is a less-often heard piece of Britten, setting words quite apt for today’s apocalyptic Gospel-reading. The poem is attributed to the sixth-century seafaring Irish monk Columba, and was composed in 1962 for a commemoration of the fourteen-hundredth anniversary of his setting sail from Ireland for the isle of Iona. By means of a relentless ostinato-figure in the organ-pedals, the music creates a suitably menacing soundscape for the scene of judgment painted in the first two stanzas, a mood but slightly soothed by the softer dynamics of the third stanza.

The music at Communion is from Britten’s brief setting of the Latin Mass, composed for the trebles of the Westminster Cathedral Choir in London in 1959. And the Postlude is Britten’s only freestanding organ-work, a piece composed in 1946 and based upon the opening theme of a renaissance motet, Victoria’s *Ecce sacerdos magnus*. It was commissioned by the same parish, St. Matthew’s, Northampton, for which Britten had composed *Rejoice in the Lamb* a few years before. The piece is notable as a modern response to the growing revival of renaissance sacred music in the mid-twentieth century.

## EECM Holiday "Berry" Program



**TODAY: Is There an Antidote to Toxic Charity?** The Rev. 

## The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Luke


{21:5-19}

So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls."
