





## MUSICAL NOTES



The great English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958) was also a scholar and musical preservationist; he roamed the countryside, collecting local folk-songs that had not yet been driven into extinction by recordings and other mass-market forces. Some of these melodies he adapted into hymn-texts, including a great many in his path-breaking *English Hymnal* of 1906. Others, like the two Welsh tunes upon which today's organ-voluntaries are based, became the thematic material for instrumental or choral compositions.

*Quasi modo geniti infantes* is traditionally the Introit for the Second Sunday of Easter – an association that inspired the naming of Victor Hugo's famous bell-ringing orphan, who was discovered by the clergy of Notre Dame on the morning of "Quasimodo" Sunday. The text of this chant opens the portion of the First Letter of Peter that we hear read this morning, where the Apostle continues with words from Psalm 34 that inspired Vaughan Williams' brief but lovely setting, paired with the chant today.

John Ireland (1879-1962) was an exact contemporary of Vaughan Williams, though a composer of more modest success; most of his works are songs and piano miniatures, but he also wrote a number of choral works for the Church. *Greater Love hath no man* is by far the most frequently-heard piece, based on a text deftly crafted from a number of disparate scriptural sources into a persuasive exhortation, set to stirring and effective music.



### A Reading from the First Letter of Peter [2:2-10]

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God’s sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: “See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.” To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, “The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner,” and “A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall.” They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.
