## MUSICAL NOTES

Alan Lewis is away this weekend, and will be back in the office on Wednesday.

The Song of Simeon, or “Nunc Dimittis,” to use its traditional title (based on the opening words of its Latin form) is the inspired utterance of the aged Simeon upon encountering the infant Jesus at his presentation by his parents in the temple in Jerusalem. St. Luke’s Gospel records this as the third of three poetic outpourings in the course of the nativity narrative – first the Magnificat, when Mary visits Elizabeth, then the Benedictus, after the naming of John the Baptist, and then this acclamation of the “light to enlighten the nations” by Simeon, to whom assurance had been given by God that he would live to see the light of salvation dawn.

The Nunc Dimittis is a traditional component of the ancient monastic bedtime office of Compline, and was incorporated into the afternoon or evening rite of Evensong by the English reformers of the sixteenth century. Virtually countless English-language settings have been composed since that time, for liturgical use; the one from Stanford’s Service in C major is arguably one of the finest and best-loved.

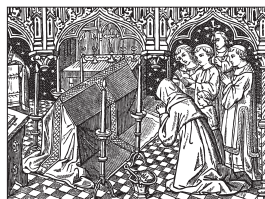

# DID YOU KNOW?

**A series of facts about the Church and Calvary in particular.**

❖ **Genuflection.** To genuflect is a sign of reverence or respect for the Blessed Sacrament (consecrated bread and wine) in the liturgy by touching one's right knee to the floor while keeping the body upright. Normally, the sign of the cross is made while one genuflects. One may genuflect on entering or leaving the pew or during the Nicene Creed at the mention of "he [Jesus] became incarnate from the Virgin Mary" as a sign of affirmation of the incarnation or God becoming one of us in Christ. Any time one genuflects one might also bow. A genuflection is simply a more profound bow.

❖ **Service Music.** Musical settings of portions of some of the constant elements of the Eucharistic rite (or Mass Ordinary), such as the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, etc., are grouped in the front section of The Hymnal 1982, along with many other elements (such as versicles, invitatories, and canticles), each with an "S" preceding its number, to denote Service Music.

Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man said to him, "My teacher, let me see again." Jesus said to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.
